

ROY KAYS, CTP, OHST, AND CDS, joined Papa Johns as a transportation manager in 2013. His wide range of management experience and training has prepared him well for the leadership position he holds. Papa Johns has undergone a major cultural transformation in recent years and seen a resurgence in its positive brand image and popularity. Market demand for its pizza and related products has grown at an unprecedented level in the company's history which began in 1984.

Troy's engagement with NPTC began in 2015. He attended the Private Fleet Management Institute andgraduated with his Certified Transportation Professional® credential with the CTP Class of 2016. His continuous engagement with NPTC ever since has been a beneficial influence on his leadership growth and career. Troy has had two promotions since becoming a CTP in 2016 and is now the Sr. Manager, Transportation Safety and Compliance.

One of America's top branded pizza companies, Louisville-based Papa John's has over 5,300

stores served by 11 Quality Control Centers located across the United States. These stores operate at various sites such as business centers, malls, sports arenas, and university campuses. Fresh pizza dough is manufactured at each Quality Control Center and delivered twice a week to each store along with sauce, pepperoni, and a total of 190 separate SKUs ranging from pizza boxes to pepperoni. In-house transportation is a key component of Papa John's success.

With a reputation for trusted delivery service, quality, and fresh food; the company has done especially well in the COVID-19 era. In fact, business is booming. "Papadias", half-pizza and half sandwich, was introduced on the menu as a \$6 item and has been a huge success. The company's safety precautions and "No contact" home delivery guarantees have brought about a tremendous surge in repeat business for millions forced to stay home for days and weeks due to COVID-19 lockdowns.

Company safety protocols require that every pizza be placed in a

sealed box, untouched by human hands, and presented by delivery drivers wearing gloves and face masks. After the pizza box is placed at the doorstep, the driver stands six feet away and awaits the customer's inspection and approval.

To meet high-volume demand, 14,000 new delivery drivers have already been hired with the goal of bringing on a total of 20,000 in 2020. Nearly 50 new CDL-A drivers have been brought on as well.

The company's private fleet, brought back to service several years ago because of service failures of outside third-party logistics companies, continues to prove its value and has grown significantly. The fleet today consists of nearly 500 drivers with Class CDL-A drivers, operating mostly in teams, with more than 200 tractors, 300 trailers, and 15 box trucks.

Louisville is Troy's home. His father worked in distribution and warehousing for Winn-Dixie and his mother was a stay-at-home mom until Troy finished high school and she enrolled in Jefferson Community College. After graduation,

Troy enrolled as a math and economics major and both he and his mother attended the college at the same time.

Troy has been married for 20 years to his wife Earlene. He has 2 children; Kylie who is a Junior in high school, and his son T.K. who is in 1st grade.

While in high school, Troy worked after hours for United Parcel Service while also operating his own Lawn care company which he had started at age 12. After college, Troy worked for Coca-Cola as a CDL-driver running intrastate routes only due to his young age. Later, he was appointed to a Route Supervisor at age 22 and learned from older colleagues the importance of humility in succeeding as a leader. He was later promoted to Service Manager.

His next move was to join a start-up company, MainServe Install, based in Greenville, South Carolina, which installed water filtration systems for fast food chains. He later became a Partner and General

Manager before selling the company. Troy moved back to Louisville and worked for Martin-Brower for three years as Transportation Manager, and then Reinhart Foods in the same role for nearly three years. Papa Johns was Troy's first direct experience with private fleet management.

"My involvement with NPTC has broadened my horizon and understanding of the full spectrum of trucking. It was my first experience in understanding the holistic side of trucking and the critical role a private fleet can play in corporate success. The PFMI and CTP experiences made that happen for me," says Troy.

Going through the Private Fleet Management Institute was his introduction to NPTC's unique culture. "Starting from dayone of the Institute, the team I was part of became a very close-knit group," says Troy reflecting on his time in Jacksonville.

"It was an eye-opener and I thoroughly embraced it. Right away, we developed a sense of professional connection and friendship which continues to this day. In our group are people from safety, accounting operations, maintenance, HR, and the supplier/vendor community. This is the significantly special value of NPTC, that of a culture of professionals who share and learn together. Now four years on, our group stays in touch while widening our circle of contact with others within the membership."

Since earning his CTP, Troy has attended Annual Conferences and National Safety Conferences, serving more than half-adozen times as speaker in breakout sessions or as moderator at breakfast roundtable discussions. This year, Troy was elected to a seat on the NPTC Board of Directors as Chair of the NPTC Conference Planning Committee.

"Papa Johns is fully committed to NPTC and plans to get even more engaged in the years ahead," Troy says. "We intend to send staff to the National Safety Conference this fall and, beginning in 2021, enroll members of our team in PFMI and the CTP® program.

"It's my honor and privilege to be part of such a great organization."

HEROES ON BOARD



OR ALMOST 90 YEARS, MERCHANTS DISTRIBUTORS, INC. (MDI) of Hickory, North Carolina, has prided itself in delivering excellent customer service. MDI is a privately-owned wholesale grocery store distributor serv-

ing some 600 retail stores with food and non-food items to more than a dozen states mostly located in the Southeast. Many customers are independent, family-owned grocery stores.

The company's president **Michele Azar** notes, "We support the food stores of Hometown America with essential expertise, infrastructure and scale, so that they can thrive and grow in a changing world. Our private fleet drivers are vital to helping us fulfill this promise. They are the frontline of our relationship with our customers. They are our every-day ambassadors."

Perhaps never in the company's history have its resources been more challenged to meet high customer demand for services than with onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. "Shortly after the virus spread into the communities we serve, our business increased 50% almost overnight" says **Paul Miller, CTP**, Director of Transportation. "Several months on, business is still up 25%."

"I'm so proud of the over 300 drivers in our fleet," says Miller. "As an entire group, they are enthusiastic about taking care of our customers. The drivers are making a tremendous difference for us and the communities we serve. We are getting phone calls from customers congratulating our drivers for exceptional service and attention to their needs."

"We wanted to recognize them in a special way to let them know how much they mean to our customers, our company, and to the country in helping bring the economy back. With the help of the company's human resource department, we came up with the idea of placing a "Hero on Board – Feeding Communities" decal on the side of each company driver's truck," says Miller.

"With the COVID-19 virus impacting our communities, we want the public and our customers to see that we honor our drivers in a special way for going above and beyond expectations," Miller noted. He points out that MDI's drivers unselfishly put themselves in danger by going into areas with high levels of COVID-19 infections, as the impact of the pandemic was much greater in many communities served by MDI compared to other parts of the country.

As Azar says, "Our driver's role is about so much more than getting product from point A to point B. It's about truly serving our customers and their communities. We couldn't do our business without them."

As a result, the transportation team was able to develop a strategy to increase and better utilize its over-the-road capacity to improve the national network efficiency by increasing both outbound and inbound loads hauled by the private fleet. In addition, they increased collaboration within PepsiCo to leverage the Frito-Lay and PepsiCo fleets to haul more of each other's freight and reduce carrier expense for Quaker and Gatorade in a "Better Together" transportation strategy. As a result, Frito-Lay's finished goods carrier ran 96.5% to prior year volume and backhaul revenue increased 107% compared to the previous year, delivering over 8% productivity to Frito-Lay's bottom line.

GERALD BARTH, who now drives for CPC Logistics, Inc. and is assigned to John Deere, started driving professionally in 1978 and has racked up more than four million miles without an accident or injury and without any moving violations. Gerry has pulled dry vans, reefers, flatbeds and grain trailers, hauling swinging meat, produce, steel coils, grain, agricultural products, dry goods, dog food, beer and military equipment.

He began his professional driving career with Holiday Express and worked briefly for several other carriers before joining CPC Logistics in 1985. Since then, he has accumulated 3.3 million miles of safe driving, winning 33 consecutive safe driving awards. He is trained in CPR and administering First Aid and attends all safety meetings. He drives about 600 miles per day, averaging up to 3,000 miles per week throughout the Midwest.



NORA BLACK has been driving with Orscheln Farm and Home, LLC for more than 12 years and has maintained a perfect driving record over 1.6 million miles. 
