NPTC BENCHMARKING RESEARCH

The National Private Truck Council has begun collecting information for its 2012 Benchmarking Survey. This survey is designed for the benefit of our members and the private fleet community. The purpose is to help members benchmark their operation to other best-in-class performers, thereby validating performance and identifying areas of opportunity.

For the second year in a row, and free to all attendees of the annual conference, is a Benchmarking Summit scheduled from 2:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 1, at the Hilton Cincinnati Netherland Plaza in Cincinnati, OH. The purpose of the summit is to take the NPTC Benchmarking Survey and do a "deep-dive" into the operating characteristics that would be pertinent to NPTC fleet members. The summit will begin with a preliminary report based on the findings to date of the NPTC Benchmarking Survey. This presentation is open to all attendees registered for the full annual conference. After that, attendees will divide along functional operational lines (long-haul, over-theroad, direct-store-delivery, flatbed, public utilities, bulk, medium-duty and the like) into small discussion groups that will be self-directed, set their own agenda, discuss topics, and follow-up plans.

On Saturday, February 11, 74 candidates sat for the prestigious Certified Transportation Professional exam in 32 locations. This is the highest number of registered candidates to sit for the exam. PRIVATE FLEET MANAGEMENT ONLINE

A new and enhanced interactive training curriculum for transportation managers is now being developed by NPTC and Instructional Technologies Inc. The online curriculum promises to deliver education and training that is practical, relevant, real-job focused—and both convenient and affordable. It will provide the foundational learning experiences for private fleet managers as they prepare for their Certified Transportation Professional® (CTP) designation. This experience-based educational and management training will prepare managers for the disciplines of running a private fleet.

The curriculum is based on a comprehensive job analysis study conducted by NPTC of its members. The study identified 47 tasks focusing on the knowledge, skills, and abilities essential to successful private fleet management. These have been categorized into the following five core disciplines: finance; fleet operational management; safety, security and compliance; human resources and workforce development; and equipment and maintenance strategies.

ACT RESEARCH ECONOMIC TREND REPORTS

NPTC and ACT Research have teamed up to perform a variety of macroeconomic trend reports for NPTC about the private fleet market. These reports break "new ground" as they represent the first distinct macroeconomic statistical data analysis of private trucking operating trends. The reports help private fleets gain a greater understanding of how big picture trends and metrics about private fleets help "sell" the private fleet value. In addition, the reports will be complementary to the "tactical" data produced each year by NPTC via the Benchmarking Survey and Benchmarking Summit.

CTP RECERTIFICATION PROCESS

With the latest class of graduates, NPTC now has nearly 900 people who have achieved the status as a Certified Transportation Professional®.

Recertification is a mandatory element of all job-based certification programs. NPTC's CTP® program is no different. The recertification requirements, established by the NPTC Institute Board of Governors in 1994, are reviewed annually. The recertification guidelines are designed to ensure the continued transportation-related education of the individuals who earn the CTP designation. Recertification points can be earned in a variety of ways, including attendance at various NPTC events, participating in various committees, or speaking in one of our many workshops, seminars or webcasts.
